Worship Guide – Psalm 56:1-11

In the midst of the oppression of his daily life, the Psalmist in Psalm 56:1-11 only asks that the Lord be gracious to him by allowing him to continue to trust in His Word at times when he otherwise is prone to forget because of the immediate fear of man (*vv. 1-6*). For he knows that in God’s Word not only

does he recall the wrath which those who are far from Him will in time experience, but by contrast, how precious God's people truly are to Him (vv. 7-9). With assurance that it is God who alone justifies through the righteousness of Christ, His people are thus able to praise and with great certainty always proclaim "*In God I trust; I will not fear, for what can mere flesh do to me?*" (vv. 4, 10-11).
